## Travel Ban 3.0 in full effect as of December 4, 2017

On December 4, 2017, the U.S. Supreme Court allowed full enforcement of Travel Ban 3.0. The Travel Ban now applies to all countries listed in the chart below effective 12:01 a.m. EST October 18, 2017. If the Travel Ban applies (see below), foreign nationals from the designated countries are now fully subject to the Travel Ban regardless of any bona fide relationship to a person or entity within U.S.

To determine if one is subject to the Travel Ban, first:

Review Scope and list of exceptions below.

### Scope:

The Travel Ban applies only to foreign nationals of the Travel Ban 3.0 designated countries (see chart on page 2) who both:

- (i) Were outside the United States on October 18, 2017; **and**
- (ii) On October 18, 2017, did not have a valid visa.

<b>Additional Exceptions: Travel Ban 3.0 <u>also</u> does not apply to foreign nationals who are:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Lawful permanent residents; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Parolees admitted to US on or after effective date October 18, 2017; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Foreign nationals who have a document other than a visa, e.g., transportation letter, advance parole document valid as of October 18, 2017; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Dual nationals travelling on a passport issued by a non-designated country; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Diplomats on G-visas; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Those granted status as Asylees; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Those granted status as Refugees; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Those granted withholding of removal by an Immigration Judge; <b>OR</b></li><li>• Those granted protection under the Convention Against Torture</li></ul>
<b>If foreign national does NOT fit within the Scope and the exceptions above do NOT apply, foreign nationals from Chad; Iran; Libya; North Korea; Venezuela; Yemen; and Syria are subject to the Travel Ban as noted in the following chart on page 2.</b>

Chad	Only B-1/B-2 applications and B-1/B-2 entries suspended	No
Iran	All temporary visa category applications and entries suspended except F, M & Js	No
Libya	Only B-1, B-2 applications and entries suspended	No
North Korea	All temporary visa categories & entries suspended	No
Venezuela	Only B-1/B-2 applications by gov't officials and their families Suspended and other temporary visa category applications are subject to additional scrutiny	Yes
Yemen	Only B-2/B-2 applications and entries are suspended	Yes
Somalia	No suspension of any nonimmigrant visa category, but adjudications and entries subject to additional scrutiny to determine if applicant connected to terrorist organization or otherwise a threat to national security or public safety	Yes
Syria	All nonimmigrant visa applications and entries suspended	Yes
<b>May apply for a Waiver of Suspension to be adjudicated by Consular Officer or CBP</b>		
Requires:		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Foreign national applicant would suffer undue hardship;</li> <li>Entry would not pose a threat to the national security or public safety of the U.S.; and</li> <li>Entry would be in the national interest</li> </ul>
