Some Interesting Ground Rules

- Look for the truth in what you oppose and the error in what you espouse
- Speak always for yourself and not for some group
- No personal attacks
- Be generous...at all times...without exception
- Come prepared, having done the background homework
- Check for understanding by paraphrasing
- Encourage all participants to take full mutual responsibility for the process and product

Nash, Bradley and Chickering (2008)

- Use active listening skills, letting everyone be heard
- · Focus on understanding, not agreement
- Build on others' ideas
- Critique the idea, not the person
- Don't generalize if it is your opinion
- This is an environment for learning, and as such, people will make mis-steps. It is okay to point them out, then explore the learning.
