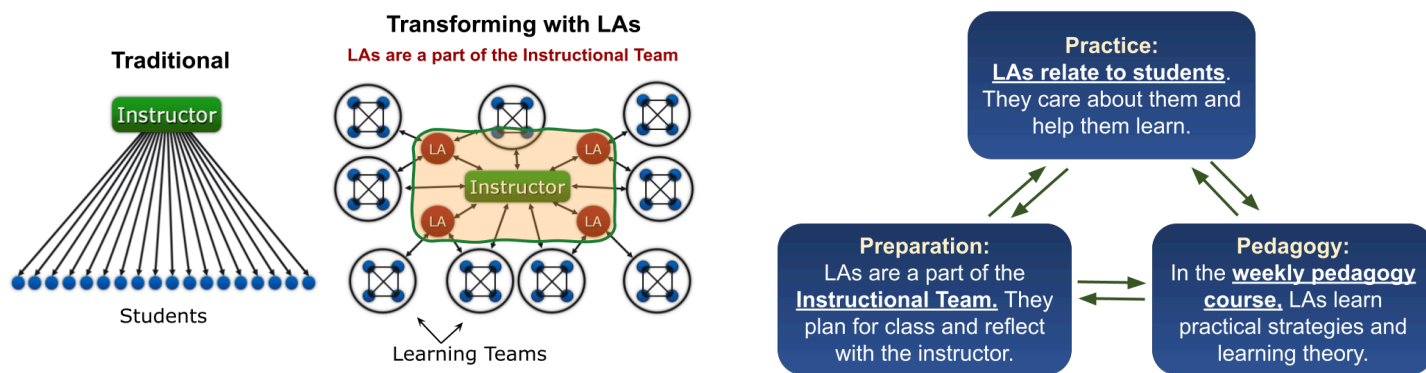




The Learning Assistant Model



Learning Assistants (LAs) are undergraduate students who serve on the instructional team in college-level courses across the world. The LA Model transforms the traditional power structure, allowing students to co-design the learning space and have voice in their educational journeys.



The Essential Elements of the LA Model

Practice: LAs facilitate discussions and activities in class, focusing on student thinking and understanding.

Preparation: Weekly meetings with instructors to plan classes and discuss student progress. LAs co-design with instructors and help implement class activities.

Pedagogy: LAs enroll in a special pedagogy course to support their development and growth as LAs, learning evidence-based strategies, student-centered and inclusive teaching practices, and practical strategies.

Evidence of Effectiveness of the LA Model

Over 100 research studies on LA Programs have demonstrated positive impacts on students and faculty!

Lower failure rates and higher retention in gateway courses

- Students in LA-supported courses experience lower failure rates and higher retention. Involvement in one LA-supported course reduces the likelihood of failing subsequent STEM courses by 60%.¹

Improved course outcomes and learning experiences

- LAs notably improve outcomes for students from underrepresented groups, fostering a sense of belonging and accessibility in learning environments.²

Institutional impact

- LA programs align with accreditation goals and Quality Enhancement Plans, increasing graduation rates and institutional engagement.³

Benefits of the LA Model

LAs rehumanize education and build connections

- LAs bridge the gap between students and faculty, making higher education more accessible and less intimidating.
- Students in LA-supported courses report LAs are more approachable than graduate TAs and professors, have “fresh” knowledge about the course, “care about me,” and “figure out what I know without making me feel dumb.”
- In addition to helping students with content, LAs provide general support to students on how to navigate the course, the institution, and how to access campus resources. Benefits extend to student wellness, a sense of belonging, equity, holistic advising, and development of STEM identities.⁴



Increased return on investment (ROI) for the institution

- Students who work on campus are more connected to the institution. LA experience cultivates leadership skills and provides significant returns by developing mentors and role models who contribute to their peers, the learning environment, academia, and the community.
- Incorporating LAs into restructured courses fosters enduring, high-impact, student-centered educational practices and promotes interdisciplinary collaboration, driving meaningful advancements for both faculty and institutions.⁵

The LA Model is world-wide.

The Learning Assistant Alliance supports the model's implementation globally, with over 3,700 members across 606 institutions in 32 countries.
